## Window display reflects social justice in the classroom

Kappa Delta Pi, a Chico State University student organization, was named winner of a window display contest sponsored by Chico Peace and Justice Center.

Kappa Delta Pi is a national honor society for students who plan to be teachers. The winning display has been reassembled and can be viewed at the center, 526 Broadway, through November.

The contest required each organization create a window display to answer the question "what does social justice look like?"
